#### 2. Call for papers

Four thematic sessions addressing relevant current topics for Latin America, the Caribbean, and globally have been configured for this meeting. Proposals should consider the main focus of ICOFOM LAC, which is museological theory and its application according to each presented session.

### Session 1. Paraguayan and Latin American Museology

Analyzing the paths of museological theory in Paraguay and Latin America, this session seeks connections between Paraguayan museological practices (historical and contemporary) and those in other countries in the region. Papers analyzing the role of schools, authors, and museum professionals within their national and regional contexts are welcome.

#### Session 2. Ethical Implications in Museum Management

Given the ongoing ICOM review of the Code of Ethics for its upcoming update, we aim to explore its potential impact. Topics such as restitution, gender, illicit trafficking, environmental action, and social issues, among others, require ethical positions by museums and their workers. This session invites reflections on these themes and experiences in addressing these issues.

## Session 3. Museums and Communities in Constant Change

The museological profession faces evolving trends—social, cultural, and political—varying by region and context. Communities interacting with museums are diverse, influenced by generational shifts, technologies, and emerging perspectives. This session addresses the challenges in museology while examining the question: What must change and what must remain in museums?

#### Session 4. Curriculum and Training in Museology



















The evolving needs of museology training vary by region, from technical certifications to advanced degrees. While some areas in Latin America are beginning academic training for museum professionals, curricula are constantly reassessed. This session seeks critical insights on current education and strategies to enhance skills for future museologists.

To promote discussion, at least one author must be PRESENT. The deadline for summary submission is **May 28, 2025.** 

#### **Formatting Guidelines**

We encourage you to adhere to the following format:

- File in .doc or .docx format.
- A4 paper size.
- Times New Roman font, size 12.
- Margins: 2.5 cm.
- Line spacing: 1.5.
- Text: justified, simple spacing, single-indent using tab.
- Maximum length: 250 words.
- No bibliographic references.

The abstracts will consist of the following sections:

- Title: in uppercase, bold, and centered.
- Name(s) and surname(s) of the author(s): written in regular font, separated by commas, and aligned to the right. Using consecutive numbering, the institutional affiliation and email address of the authors will be indicated after the names.
- Main text: The text should be concise, presenting the objectives of the work, main aspects, theoretical framework, and conclusions.
- ◆ Keywords: Below the text, keywords should be included, up to a maximum of five (5). They must be written in regular font, lowercase, aligned to the left, and separated by dashes.
